

General Information

Eligibility Information

Johnston County Senior Games is open to all Johnston County or any surrounding county residents on a case-by-case basis who are 50 years of age or better by December 31, 2025. A participant must be a North Carolina resident for a minimum of three (3) consecutive months of the year.

Men and women compete in separate categories in the following five year age group:

50-54 55-59 60-64 65-69 70-74 75-79 80-84 85-89 90-94 95-99 100+

Entry Fees

\$20 (Paper Form) / \$15 (Online) includes t-shirt, medal, Kick-Off Celebration & Opening Ceremonies Lunch, SilverArts Showcase and Gala Dinner, and participation in **UNLIMITED** Athletic/SilverArts events. Billiards, Bowling, Golf, and Mini Golf have additional fees. All other events include snacks/drinks. If you'd like to bring a guest to the SilverArts Showcase and Gala featuring the SilverArts Follies, you can purchase one additional ticket at registration.

Local Games Are for Everyone!

Safety and sportsman like conduct are paramount. Johnston County Senior Games officials have the authority to disqualify, and/or remove anyone who exhibits inappropriate behavior or a condition of medical concern.

We request that every participant consult his/her doctor in regard to preparation for, and competition in, Senior Games or any similar activity. To promote total health and physical fitness, events of longer duration and lower intensity are strongly recommended. High-intensity types of activities are offered primarily for the conditioned, trained athlete.

Rules

All events will be conducted in accordance with the 2025 Edition of the North Carolina Senior Games Inc. Official Rule Book. Rules for all events are available at www.ncseniorgames.org or by contacting any of the local coordinating agencies.

Inclement Weather Plans

Plan for all types of weather! Please check with event managers for changes in schedules. JCSG reserves the right to change tournament format or postpone and/or cancel events in case of inclement weather. Schedule changes will be posted at the venue, JCSG Facebook page, or a participant can call 919-553-1550 for updates.

Medal/Ribbons

Each participant will receive a medal at the Kick-Off Celebration and Opening Ceremonies.

In athletic events, top finishers in each age group (male and female) will receive gold, silver, or bronze pins to attach to their medal. Pins will be awarded onsite after each day's events.

In SilverArts, top finishers in each sub-category will receive blue, red, or white ribbons. Ribbons will be awarded at the SilverArts Showcase and Gala Dinner on Thursday, May 8, 2025, where winning artists will be recognized. ALL participants and a guest are invited to attend, but RSVP is required by Friday, March 14, 2025.

State Finals Eligibility

State Finals qualification criteria returns to pre-covid standards with the exception of open events. The Full qualification policy is as follows:

- The top three male and female qualifiers in each official North Carolina Senior Games sport/event in each age category will be eligible to participate in State Finals, including bowling.
- Golfers must meet a minimum performance score (MPS) and finish first, second, and third to qualify.
- All participants who complete a Local Games Fun Walk, Football Throw, Softball Throw and Basketball Shooting will qualify.
- Teams: The first, second and third place teams for each team sport age category will qualify.
- In SilverArts, each Local Games may qualify:
 a.) One entry in Performing Arts and the Cheerleader
 Showcase. b.) First and second place in each Literary
 Arts sub-category, provided the places are not won
 by the same artist. c.) First, second and third place
 entry in each Visual Arts and Heritage Arts subcategory, provided the places are not won by the
 same artist (i.e. only one entry by the same artist per
 sub-category).

National Senior Games

The National Senior Games are held every two years. 2026 will be the qualifying year for the National Games to be held in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in 2027. For more info, visit nsga.com.

Athletes Information

Doubles Events

For events requiring a partner, all team members must be registered Johnston County Senior Games participants, as indicated on the Registration Form. JCSG does not assign partners.

Partners may play down to a younger age group, with the younger player's age determining the group. Each player can only compete in one age group per event. The deadline to change partners is the cancellation deadline; no changes can be made at the event.

Event Check-In

Participants must arrive at the event site 30 minutes before the event begins or your scheduled event time. When you arrive, please check in with the event manager. A photo ID is required. **Start time is forfeit time.**

Golf

Participants are required to supply their clubs and balls. Golfers may indicate those with whom they would prefer to be paired by emailing the local coordinator. Depending upon participation, golfers may be paired with others by age category. Pairings at the event start are final. Golfers may also be given a tee time instead of a "shotgun" start.

Online Partner Entry

The second partner to register can choose their partner with online entry. The first partner to register in a partnered event will not be able to indicate the other partner's name. After one partner registers for a partnered event, the next partner will be able to select the desired partner and the two will be linked.

State Finals Partners

Participants may substitute a partner if the qualifying partner from Local Games is unable to attend State Finals. The substitute must have qualified in that event to be eligible to participate in State Finals.

The exhibit runs until 7 PM on Thursday, May 8. Artists must pick up their work **AFTER** the SilverArts Performance Showcase & Gala Dinner on May 8, from 3:30-6:00 PM.

Limit of 3 pieces per sub-category

VISUAL ARTS

Sub-Categories: Acrylics, Drawing, Mixed Media 2D, Mixed Media 3D, Oil, Pastels, Photography, Sculpture, Watercolor

- All artwork, except free standing pieces, must be framed (or gallery wrapped), securely wired, and ready to be hung (no serrated hooks or string).
 Artwork, not properly wired will not be displayed.
- Artwork, except free standing pieces, can be no larger than 36" x 42", including matting and frame.
- Free standing pieces may be Sculpture, Mixed media & Digital Art
- Freestanding entries must be able to be displayed in an area 3' (W) x 3' (L) x 5' (height).
- Entries can be no heavier than 50 pounds.
- Groupings (sets) may have no more than 3 pieces per grouping (set).
- Photography Film or Digital determined by the medium on which the image is recorded.
- Artists, or their representatives, are responsible to deliver and pick-up their entry at/during the designated times.
- If on-site assembly is required, details must be specified on the Information Form for NCSG prior approval.
- The art piece must be an original work, not a print.
- Artist's name and title of entry must appear on, or be attached to, entry for identification.
- Artist must submit a photo of entry when registering online or with State Finals Entry Form and SilverArts Information Form. Photos cannot be returned.
- An artist may only submit one (1) entry per subcategory at State Finals.

HERITAGE ARTS

Sub-Categories: Basket Weaving, Crocheting, Jewelry, Knitting, Needlework, Quilting (Handstitched & Machine stitched), Stained Glass, Tole/Decorative Painting, Pottery (Thrown & Hand built), Weaving, Woodcarving, Woodturning, Woodworking

- Entries must be the work of the individual and not a group.
- Heritage Art entries must be an original work.
 Patterns may be used, but no stamped pieces will be accepted.
- Pottery must be hand built or thrown.
- Entries from ceramic molds will not be accepted.
- All framed entries must be securely wired, ready to be hung (no serrated hooks or string). Twodimensional work not properly framed and wired will not be displayed.
- Framed entries can be no larger than 36" x
 42", including matting and frame.
- All entries, except framed work, must be able to be displayed in an area 3'(W) x 3'(L) x 5' (Height).
- Entries can be no heavier than 50 pounds.
- Groupings (sets) shall have no more than 3 separate pieces per set. All objects within each piece of the set must be contained within or attached to one of the 3 pieces of the set.
- Artist's name and title of entry must appear on, or be attached to, entry for identification.
- Artist must submit a photo of entry when registering online or with State Finals Entry Form and SilverArts Information Form. Photos cannot be returned.
- Artists, or their representatives, are responsible to deliver and pick-up their entry at/during the designated times.
- The heritage arts entry entered at State Finals must be the same entry that won at the Local Games.
- An artist may only submit one (1) entry per subcategory at State Finals.

SilverArts Rules & Information

LITERARY ARTS

All entries must be received by February 28, 2025.

Sub-Categories: Essay, Life Experience, Poem, Short Story-Fiction

- All Essay, Life Experience, and Short Story entries must be typed, double-spaced on 8-1/2 x 11 paper, and have a minimum of 1" margins. A minimum font size is 10-pt type (preferably "times new roman or arial"). Essays, Life Experiences, and Short Stories can be no longer than 8 pages.
- Poetry entries must be typed, on 8-1/2 x 11 paper, and have a minimum of 1" margins, but double spacing is not required.
 (Appearance must support and contribute to the meaning of the poem and its impact.) A minimum font size is 10-pt type (preferably "times new roman or arial"). Poems can be no longer than 40 lines.
- All entries must have a title page, which includes title of entry, sub-category, and name of artist. Artist's name must not appear on the content pages.
- A display-quality copy of the winning Literary Arts entries must be submitted upon registration. Online copies must be in a pdf format. Mailed copies should have one original and two additional copies with their official State Finals Entry Form and SilverArts Information Form. No framed or matted entries will be accepted.
- The original and all copies will be retained by NCSG.
- The literary arts entry entered at State Finals must be the same entry that won at the Local Games.
- An artist may only submit one (1) entry per sub-category at State Finals.

PERFORMING ARTS SHOWCASE

Thursday, May 8 at 4:30 PM—Smithfield Recreation and Aquatic Center Sub-Categories: Comedy/Drama, Dance, Instrumental, Line Dance & Vocal

- An artist may only have one (1) entry per size of act in each sub-category.
- Performing entries are limited to three (3) minutes of on-stage time. Exceeding the time limit will result in automatic disqualification. Timing is the performer's responsibility and begins with the first note of music or the first movement visible to the audience and ends with the final note of music or movement of the act.
- Performing entries may be one of the following: (a) soloists, (b) small groups (2 4 performers), or (c) large groups (5 or more performers). Accompanist(s) will not be counted to determine size of act, but no one under age 50 as of Dec. 31st will be permitted on stage and an accompanist must be a registered participant.
- At State Finals, all performers for all acts must enter and exit stage left or begin and end on the stage.
- At State Finals, recorded music must be in MP3 format (submitted electronically or on a flash drive; CDs not accepted). Submit music with online registration or with the State Finals Entry Form. No instructional tracks allowed. Music will be returned after the performance but cannot be mailed.
- At State Finals, NCSG can provide the following items: chairs, microphone(s), piano and sound system. The act is responsible for all other props and equipment and must get NCSG advance approval for use at Show. Props must be small, few, light-weight and easy to set up quickly.
- Voice presentations must be a live performance by the artist. Background music can be recorded. Lip-synch is not permitted in any vocal category.
- The Group Leader, who must be a participant, must complete the SilverArts Information Form for the group and submit it with their State Finals online registration or Entry Form and each member of the group must submit their own personal State Finals Entry Form by the August 1st deadline.
- The performance at State Finals must be the same performance that won at the Local Games; i.e. same song, dance, music, etc.
- No live animals are allowed, except for service animals.
